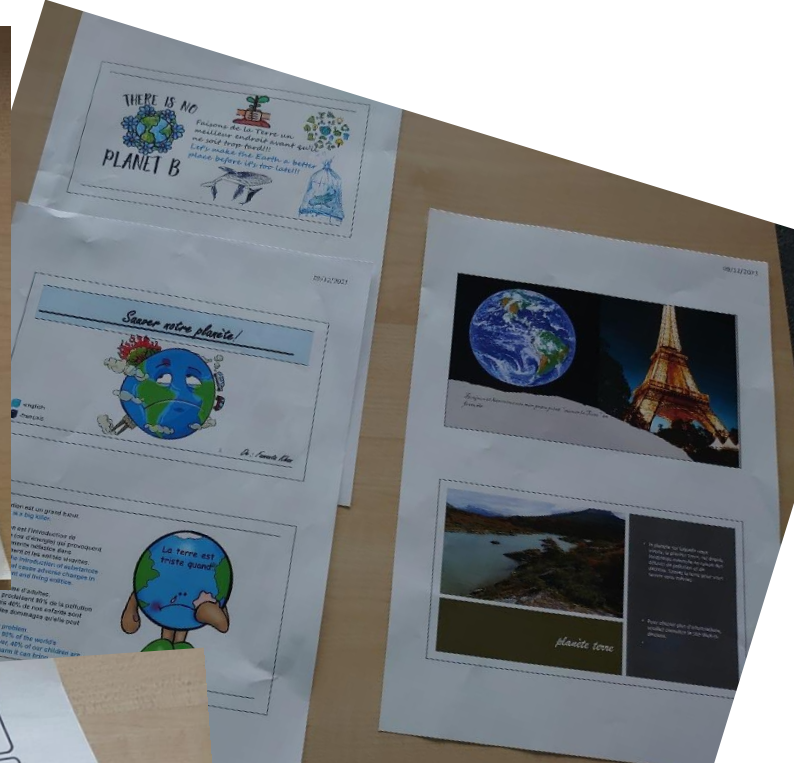
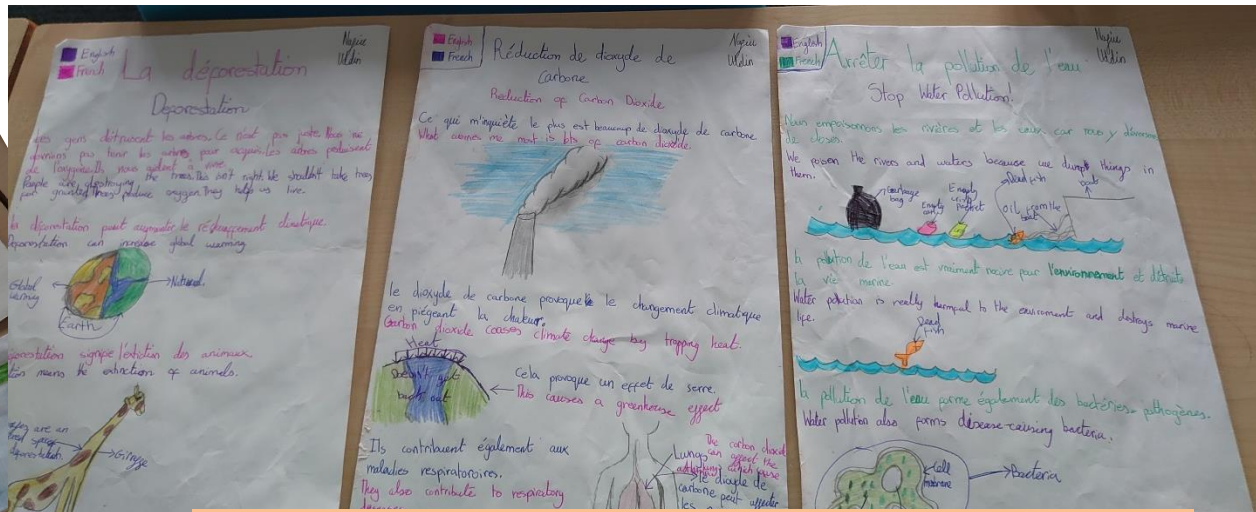

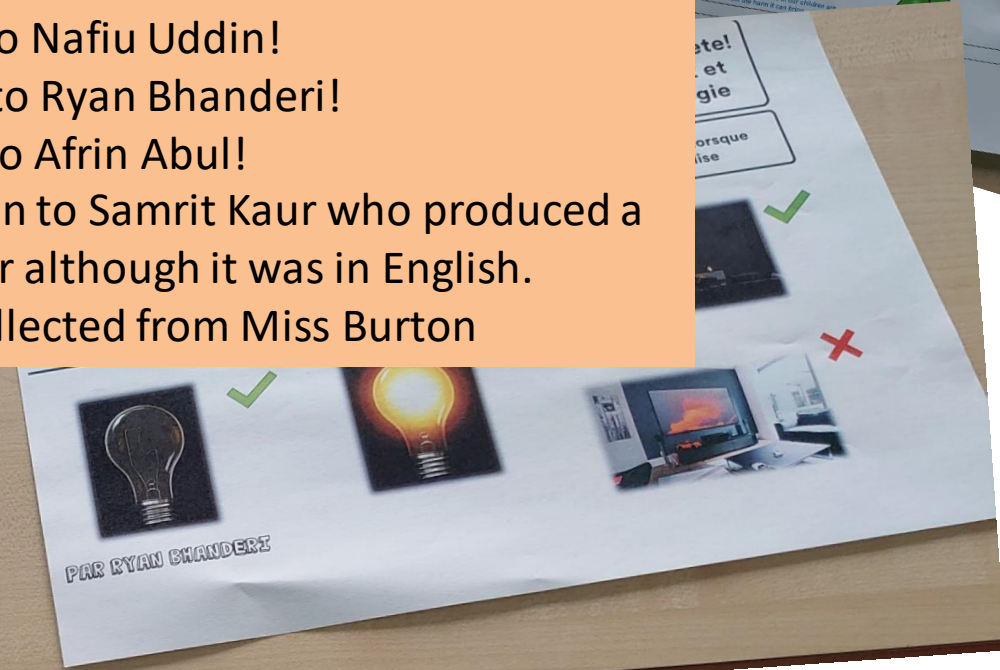

- Playing cards.



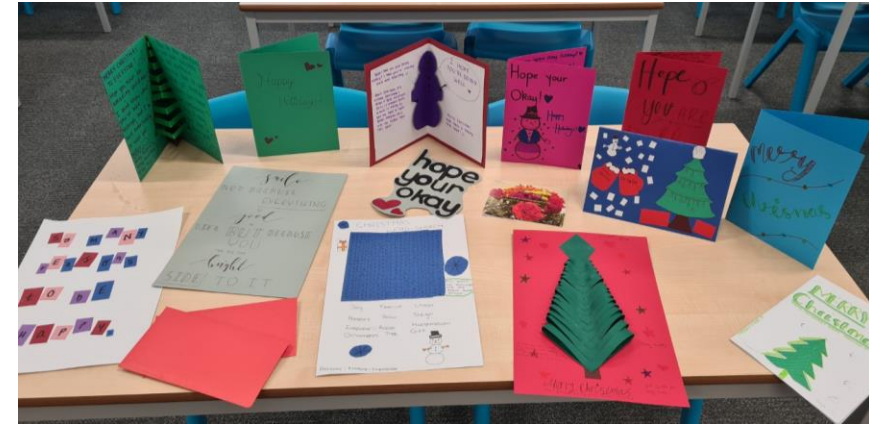

## 13<sup>th</sup> December 2021 – National Migrants Day



**Social** - In 2000, the United Nations General Assembly declared the 18th December as International Migrants Day. Since then, it has been celebrated on the 18th December each year. This year, in 2021, this falls on a Saturday.

On 18 December 1990, the General Assembly adopted a resolution on the International Convention on the Protection of the Rights of All Migrant Workers and Members of Their Families. Each year on December 18, the United Nations, through the UN-related agency International Organization for Migration, uses International Migrants Day to highlight the contributions made by the roughly 272 million migrants, including more than 41 million internally displaced persons, and the challenges they face.

Although leaving home to migrate to another country can be exciting, it can also be a very daunting and dangerous journey. The United Nations works hard to ensure that migrants are not being exploited. International Migrants Day helps to remind us to work together to ensure that migration is a safe and positive experience for all. Protecting migrants is even more important during the current global Covid-19 pandemic. UN Secretary, General António Guterres says,

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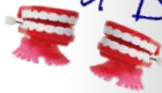
