



Moral - LGBT+ History Month takes place every February and it is a time to look back at important events from LGBT+ History and reflect on where we have come as a community.



This is not just an month for LGBT+ individuals, but also for those outside our community to learn about the struggles of our community.





In the aim of equality between homosexuals and heterosexuals, a campaign was launched in the 1990's by the campaign group OutRage! this was because a man and a woman could legally have sex at 16, but homosexuals could not until they were 21. This was taken to the European Commission of Human Rights in 1997 but it wasn't until 2001 that the age of consent was equalised.


Same-sex marriage was finally achieved in England, Wales, Scotland in 2014 but was not achieved in Northern Ireland until January 2020.

This now means that those of the same-sex, just over 50 years since homosexuality was made legal in the UK, could now marry the person they loved.

The world of LGBT+ people is a diverse one, but I have collated a few faces from history that have changed the perceptions of LGBT+ people.

There are, of course, thousands of people who have made an impact on the LGBT+ community, but here are just a few.


