





17th May 2021 – Biodiversity Day



Moral— The United Nations has proclaimed May 22 The International Day for Biological Diversity (IDB) to increase understanding and awareness of biodiversity issues. The Biodiversity Day 2021 slogan: "We're part of the solution". The slogan was chosen to be a continuation of the momentum generated last year under the over-arching theme, "Our solutions are in nature", which served as a reminder that biodiversity remains the answer to several sustainable development challenges.


We're part of the solution #ForNature

About 1.7 million species of animals, plants and fungi have been recorded, but there are likely to be 8-9 million and possibly up to 100 million. The heartland of biodiversity is the tropics, which teems with species. In 15 hectares (37 acres) of Borneo forest, for example, there are 700 species of tree – the same number as the whole of North America. The concern is that many species are being lost before we are even aware of them, or the role they play in the circle of life.

How do you think we are impacting the earth's biodiversity? How can we help protect it?



The air you breathe, the water you drink and the food you eat all rely on biodiversity, but right now it is in crisis – because of us. It is the variety of life on Earth, in all its forms and all its interactions.



Start off small by improving the biodiversity of your garden. Bee and butterfly friendly plants are the best things you can use. This will lead to more wildlife and greater variety in the area, including birds and small mammals. Provide bird seed, water and mealworms and leave parts of your hedges, trees and grass overgrown to allow for birds to nest and insects to lay their eggs.
