Closing date is 13th December


### What is the shoebox appeal?

### Jólabókaflóð Yule Book Flood


Jólabókaflóð, or "Yule Book Flood" originated during World War II when foreign imports were restricted, but paper was cheap.





### 29th November 2021 – St Andrews Day

STANDREWS DAY, NOVEMBER 30th

**Cultural** - Saint Andrew's Day, also called the Feast of Saint Andrew or Andermas, is the feast day of Andrew the Apostle. It is celebrated on 30 November. Saint Andrew's Day is Scotland's official national day. It has been a national holiday in Romania since 2015.

Most country's have an associated Saint and have days during the year where they are celebrated and remembered. The 30<sup>th</sup> of November, is St Andrews Day. He is also the patron saint of Romania, Greece, Russia, Ukraine and Poland. Patron saints are chosen to be special protectors or guardians over things.

Do you know any other Patron Saints which UK countries celebrate?

We don't actually know a lot about St Andrew. It is believed that he was born between the years 5 AD and 10 AD in a place that is now part of Israel. According to Christianity, he went on to become one of the 12 disciples of Jesus Christ. The disciples were 12 people chosen by Jesus to closely follow him.

What do you think St Andrew has to do with Scotland?

One story says that in the 9th Century, King Angus in Scotland was preparing for a battle against the English. St Andrew appeared to King Angus in a dream promising him victory and on the day of the battle, an X symbol appeared in the sky, which was the symbol of St Andrew. He vowed that if they won, St Andrew would be made the patron saint of Scotland - and that is exactly what happened. This is why the Scotlish flag has the X-shaped cross on it, as it is St Andrew's symbol. St Andrew was officially named the patron saint of Scotland in 1320.
