

What an achievement for JLA students last academic year in producing our best ever GCSE results!


- 69.7% of students gained a grade 4 or above in English.
- 66.5% of students gained a grade 4 or above in Maths.
- 59% of students gained five grades 4 to 9 including English and Maths.

The academy has gained a progress 8 score of 0.44 which puts us as the third best school in the Walsall LEA, below our two local grammars. Well done to all staff and students on this success!


Lessons in Leckie
