Dear Parents/carers,

RE: Year 8 Mock Exams-7th and 8th February 2024

As you are aware, Year 8 is a key time for students at Joseph Leckie Academy, not least because they will be opting for their GCSE and vocational subjects in the coming months. In preparation for this decision and to ensure that they are developing their preparedness for formal examinations, we are holding five mock examinations for all year 8 students on Wednesday 7th and Thursday 8th February 2024. These will be an opportunity for all Year 8 students to take formal examinations in the Sports Hall, where they will take their GCSEs in coming years. This will also be a good opportunity for us to establish where your child is, in terms of the knowledge and skills application they have developed with us over Years 7 and 8. The timetable for these mock examinations is outlined below. All students will be taking the same subjects.

We want all students to take these examinations seriously as they will be an opportunity to show us their abilities and will influence options and setting for them in Year 9. There will be examinations and assessments in all other subjects held across this week and the week after half term, although these will be held in lessons rather than in the Sports Hall.

All students are expected to comply with examination expectations in exactly the same way that they would be if these were formal, external exams. They will have a reminder PowerPoint delivered by form tutors in their form time this week about these expectations and Mr Greaves is speaking to them in assembly, regarding these examination regulations so all of them are well-versed on examination expectations. However, if you would remind them of the importance of a few key points regarding this, that would be very helpful. There can be no mobile phones, watches, non-clear pencil cases or non-clear drinks bottles of any sort in the examination room at any time. Students will leave all coats, bags, mobile phones and any equipment not required for the examination in their lesson classrooms before the

examination, where they will be stored until the end of the exam. Students will be provided with all equipment needed to complete the examinations, so they need not bring anything into the exam room at all. It also goes without saying that poor behaviour is against examination regulations and silence must be observed at all times in the examination room.

If students are found breaking any of the examination regulations above or those set out in the JCQ guidelines, also published on our Academy website, they will be sanctioned according to JCQ exam regulations. This can range from exclusion from future exams, a zero grade for that examination or all examinations in the series or further Academy sanctions dependent on the severity of their misconduct.

I know we can rely on you for support with your children, in regards to these exams, and that you will reinforce their importance and the importance of revision and preparation with your children.
