We are writing to update and remind you of some important information for the coming week and the teacher training day calendared on Friday 20th June.

## Eid al-Adha 2025

We understand that many members of our academy community will be celebrating Eid al-Adha next weekend. We are also aware that some mosques may observe Eid on Friday.

This year, a number of important GCSE and A Level examinations are scheduled to take place on that Friday, and it is essential that there is no disruption to these. Alongside the exams, we have a carefully planned timetable of revision sessions to support all students, which will continue as usual whilst other years are involved in critical revision and preparations for upcoming mock assessments. As a result, Friday will be a normal school day for all students and staff, and we will not be able to authorise any absences on that day.

We respectfully ask all families to support our students by ensuring full attendance throughout the week, across all year groups. We are aware that many students took a day of authorised absence to observe Eid al-Fitr earlier in the year. In line with Department for Education guidance, schools are only able to authorise one day of religious observance per academic year.

We appreciate the importance of Eid and the significance it holds for our Muslim students and their families. While we are unable to grant leave on this occasion due to exam commitments and statutory attendance requirements, we want to express our sincere thanks for your understanding and continued support.

We would like to take this opportunity to wish all those celebrating a peaceful and joyful Eid al-Adha.
