If you do not have your instrument at home, you can still work on your general musicianship. Use YouTube or even just a radio station to play some music – anything will work from any music style.

Sing along to the main tune, listening carefully to stay in tune
Clap along to the beat, then make up a full body beat – finger clicks, claps, knee slaps, stamps etc. Be sure to keep in time!
If there are other people at home with you, create a performance of a song or rap – some of you take the chorus, some take the verse.

Try to create a complete version of the song using just your voices and body sounds!
