# LUNCH AT THE ACADEMY

All Year 7 students will have lunch between 12:45pm to 13:15pm in the canteen. The Academy lunches and break-time food services are provided by our own Joseph Leckie Academy Kitchen team, supported by CMC. We carefully plan menus with well balanced meals, to support students throughout the day and further help with concentration and behaviour.

At the Academy, we use a biometric cashless (finger print) system. This means that students will no longer have to carry lunch money, instead when paying for lunch their fingerprint will be scanned and payment taken from their academy account. Money can be loaded onto the students' account via ParentMail, our online payment system. The Academy will also be introducing an ID card payment system in addition to this.

If your child is entitled to Free School Meals, please ensure you have completed the online application form.

# ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

Regular attendance at the Academy is vital to help your child achieve and get the best possible start in life. Children who frequently miss school often fall behind. There is a strong link between good attendance and achieving good results. Please do not book holidays during term time as leave will only be granted in exceptional circumstances. Where possible, please also keep medical appointments outside of the normal academy day.

If your child is unable to attend the Academy, please notify the Academy as soon as possible.

Punctuality is just as important as good attendance. Being punctual means making sure your child is at school and ready to learn before the bell goes. Please ensure your child eats a healthy breakfast and arrives by 8:30am every day. We also have a breakfast club available at the Academy and your child can attend this, free of charge, from 8:00am every day. This will commence from Monday 12<sup>th</sup> September 2022.

Lost minutes means lost learning and therefore it is equally important that your child gets to the start of every lesson on time.



# **READY TO LEARN**

To ensure you child makes the very best of their learning opportunities, students are expected to have the following items with them during every school day:

- Pens (black, blue, green (for carrying out corrections))
- Pencils
- Ruler
- Rubber
- Pencil sharpener
- Reading Book
- Student Planner Provided by the Academy
- PE Kit (On days they have PE)

Students will also benefit from having a Casio FX85GTX CLASSWIZ calculator.

It is highly recommended students bring a school bag pack to keep their personal belongings and a pencil case to contain their stationery.

Stationery and a fully equipped pencil case is available to purchase from the Academy via ParentMail.

# **MOBILE PHONES AND ELECTRONIC DEVICES**

Mobile phones and other electronic devices are not allowed to be used on the Academy premises at any time. We operate an "on site, out of sight" policy so in the event that your child does carry a mobile phone/electronic device to the Academy, this must not be seen or heard from the moment they come through the Academy gates. If a mobile phone is seen / used during the Academy day, it will be confiscated and only returned after an after school detention has been completed.

If you need to contact your child during the Academy day, please contact the Academy Reception and we will get a message to your child as soon as possible.

# **KEY STAGE 3 CURRICULUM**

Throughout years 7 and 8, Key Stage 3 students will experience the full statutory range of subjects of the National Curriculum, including citizenship, relationships and sex education, health education, religious education and other aspects of PSHE and careers education.

We offer a broad and balanced curriculum and with a wide range of subjects as well as many enrichment opportunities within and beyond the curriculum. This enables all students to develop the knowledge and skills to prepare them for their next phase of learning and lay the foundation for learning and success for their future.

Our curriculum is ambitious for all our students. It is coherently planned and sequenced so new knowledge and skills are built on prior learning, effectively differentiated, accessible and inspiring to enable all students of all abilities to fully engage in the curriculum and achieve their full potential.

Students are taught within two bands called J and L and are placed into sets within these bands based on prior attainment and ability in a specific subject. Subjects studied at this stage provide excellent foundations for GCSE study, which begins in Year 9.

# **GIFTED AND TALENTED**

The gifted and talented focus at JLA is about taking students identified as being high ability in their subjects and stretching them further.

We, as an Academy, recognise that there is no such thing as a typical gifted or talented student. Each is an individual and demonstrates widely differing patterns of behaviour, skills, aptitudes and attainments.

Some students coming into the Academy may already show behaviours and attitudes associated with being gifted and talented. If you believe your child should be considered for gifted and talented, please complete the Gifted & Talented Form on our website's Transition page.

If your child is identified as gifted or talented, they will receive a range of support from their subject teachers and myself, as the gifted and talented coordinator.

#### REWARDS

#### HOMEWORK


At the Academy, we believe that homework should provide the opportunity for students to enhance their learning. Homework set will reinforce what is learned during school time and allow students to develop their research skills. When set, students are encouraged to record homework in their planners. The Academy Homework Policy is available on our website.

#### WELLBEING

At Joseph Leckie Academy, the wellbeing of our students and staff are absolutely critical to our success as a school and we have a wellbeing and support structure that allows students to learn to self-manage their wellbeing as well as knowing where to go in the Academy for support and guidance at times when they need it. Mr Greaves is the leadership team link for Wellbeing and Mental Health and he works alongside Mrs Manning, who is the student wellbeing co-ordinator, in order to provide and manage a wellbeing provision that takes into account the varying student needs that we have in the Academy. As well as a Wellbeing Sharepoint Site that all students can access that guides them to internal and external support sources, we also provide a counselling service on site and bereavement and mentoring services which can be accessed by any student who is referred. We are currently working towards national recognition as a Wellbeing Award school and are confident that we will achieve this status by the end of 2022. As part of this, we have 21 Student Wellbeing Ambassadors that are students from every year group who provide peer-to-peer support as well as assisting the wellbeing team with wider Academy projects to improve the wellbeing of our student body. Staff wellbeing is overseen by Staff Wellbeing Coordinators, Mrs Van Daalen and Miss Choudhury, who focus on ensuring that staff are happy in their working environment, so that they can best educate our students. We are a nurturing and caring school with an established wellbeing provision which works towards all students realising that they have different wellbeing needs and requirements. This works towards our Academy values of Empathy, Kindness and Community.

# ACADEMY COUNCIL

We have a vibrant Academy Council at Joseph Leckie which, including sixth form, contains over 200 members in total. Each form group elects representatives, democratically, at the beginning of the academic year and these students sit on a year group council which meets once every half term. The councils discuss and make decisions on a full range of requirements for the Academy and ensure that students all have a voice through their representatives on decisions made for current and future planning. These councils then select representatives from each year group to meet with the SLT and explain the findings of their meetings. This process allows students to ensure that their voice is heard and, this year alone, this has led to changes in Academy uniform provision, canteen food provision, the introduction of playground table tennis and basketball facilities and the introduction of the, hugely successful, cultural diversity day. Ofsted have recognised the importance and impact of the Academy Council and we are proud that so many students play such an integral part in the lives of the other students. We have student voice at the core of our provision and believe that this fits in well with our values of Leadership, Environment and Integrity.



#### STUDENT SUPPORT

Our Student Support Centre works alongside all Head of Years and Staff at Joseph Leckie Academy to ensure the wellbeing and happiness of your child. This is paramount to us to ensure their individual success not only at school but for their future.

Starting Secondary school can be very daunting not only for your child but for you as their Parent/Carer. We are here to liaise with you and to meet all the needs of your child. We are available for advice, questions, referrals and any information you may require or may be worried about to put your mind at ease.

Services we provide to the students at the Academy include:

- One to one mentoring to discuss problems and solutions.
- Individual and group sessions delivering particular programmes of work.
- Support with transition for new students and students with specific needs. This includes individualised timetables to support with integration.
- Help with coursework, home work and organisational skills.
- Referrals to external agencies to support students.
- Help students to overcome barriers to learning.
- Raise achievement and attainment.
- Improve individual social skills and increase self-esteem, confidence and alleviate anxiety.
- Motivate disengaged students.

#### LEARNING SUPPORT (SEND)

I am Mr Wallworth, the Head of Learning Support. I have been in post five years and have a team of 18 Teaching Assistants. We will all be working closely with the Head of Year to ensure that your child's transition to Joseph Leckie Academy meets their individual needs.

At Joseph Leckie Academy, we recognise that transition can be a difficult time for all children especially children with additional needs. I would like to take this opportunity to assure you that we will take steps to ensure that your child's move from their primary school to Joseph Leckie Academy will be as smooth as possible.

To Achieve this, we work in partnership with our feeder schools to ensure we have as much information about your child as possible, to support their move and understand their preferred learning style. Your child's transition to our Academy is a key priority to me and I will be available to discuss this with you via email or on the telephone.

All students with additional needs benefit from a personalised pupil passport and this will be completed with the support of a Teaching Assistant and shared with all teachers. Furthermore, my team of Teaching Assistants and I will do all we can to ensure we are here to support yours and your child's needs.

# PHYSICAL EDUCATION

#### **PE Lessons at JLA**

All students will have two lessons of PE a week in Year 7. PE allows your child to develop lots of skills such as team work, communication and organisation. It is also vital for their physical and mental wellbeing.

At various times of the year they will take part in a range of physical activities. These will include; swimming, football, rugby, volleyball, gymnastics, athletics, softball and rounder's.

# **Extra-Curricular Opportunities**

All students are encouraged to take part in extra-curricular clubs while at JLA. A variety of clubs are offered at lunch time and after school for students to get involved in. These include; cricket, table-tennis, basketball, swimming, football, volleyball, dance, cheerleading and badminton.



Students also have the opportunity to take part in Sports Leaders and achieve a Level One qualification.

#### **Team and House Competitions**

Students are encouraged to take part in a range of house competitions across the academic year. Through taking part, they are awarded with points which go towards their House total.

As well as House competitions, students also compete in a range of activities / sports against other Walsall schools.





# ACADEMY HOUSE SYSTEM

Our main aim at Joseph Leckie Academy is to ensure your child leaves school equipped with the tools needed for life. The most obvious way to do this is to achieve good exam results but we know there is more to Academy life than this. This is where the house system comes in!

The Joseph Leckie Academy house system runs competitions all year round that are both academic and hobby based. Each student has a duty to compete in competitions, representing their house when they do. Over the past 12 months the house team have coordinated competitions from a wide range of different areas; from Basketball to Bake-offs, from International Women's Day to D-Day Art competitions, from French Café Menu design to FIFA tournaments. Zodiac house is led by Mr Potter and are named after a group of Stars in the sky. Zodiac members wear Yellow.










#### LIBRARY

# My child is the only one coming to JLA from their primary school. As a parent, I am really worried. What provisions would be put in place?

We have a number of students coming from a number of Primary Schools. We have ensured students who are coming to JLA on their own, are paired in a form with another student in the same situation to enable them to make new friends and settle in well.

# My child is really anxious and worries about starting Secondary school. How will they be supported at JLA?

All children are nervous and excited to start Secondary School. If they are worried or unsure about anything they can talk to their form tutor/subject teacher, Ms Griffin (Head of Year), Mr Hussain (Assistant Head of Year) any other member of staff at JLA who will be more than happy to help. We are here to provide the best support and guidance possible, both academically and pastorally.

#### What subjects will my child study in Year 7?

At Joseph Leckie Academy, students will experience the full statutory range of subjects from the National Curriculum. This includes core Subjects (Maths, English, Science and Physical Education), Humanities (History, Geography, Religious education) Technology, ICT/Computer Studies, Art, Music and French.

#### What is ParentMail?

ParentMail is our online payment system at the Academy. Money can be transferred on to your child's account via the app to pay for Academy lunches, trips and the purchasing of Academy items.
