

LUNCH AT THE ACADEMY

All Year 7 students will have lunch between 1:00pm to 1:30pm in the canteen. The Academy lunches and break-time food services are provided by Aspens. Aspens carefully plan menus with well balanced meals, to support students throughout the day and further help with concentration and behaviour.

At the Academy, we use a biometric cashless (finger print) system. This means that students will no longer have to carry lunch money, instead when paying for lunch their fingerprint will be scanned and payment taken from their academy account. Money can be loaded onto the students' account via ParentMail, our online payment system. The Academy will also be introducing an ID card payment system in addition to this.

If your child is entitled to Free School Meals, please ensure you have completed the online application form.

Students can also bring a packed lunch from home to eat at the Academy, if they wish.

ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

Regular attendance at the Academy is vital to help your child achieve and get the best possible start in life. Children who frequently miss school often fall behind. There is a strong link between good attendance and achieving good results. Please do not book holidays during term time as leave will only be granted in exceptional circumstances. Where possible, please also keep medical appointments outside of the normal academy day.

If your child is unable to attend the Academy, please notify the Academy as soon as possible.

Punctuality is just as important as good attendance. Being punctual means making sure your child is at school and ready to learn before the bell goes. Please ensure your child eats a healthy breakfast and arrives by 8:30am every day. We also have a breakfast club available at the Academy and your child can attend this, free of charge, from 8:00am every day. This will commence from Monday 7th September 2020.

Lost minutes means lost learning and therefore it is equally important that your child gets to the start of every lesson on time.



READY TO LEARN

To ensure your child makes the very best of their learning opportunities, students are expected to have the following items with them during every school day:

- Pens (black, blue, green (for carrying out corrections))
- Pencils
- Ruler
- Rubber
- Pencil sharpener
- Reading Book
- Student Planner – Provided by the Academy
- PE Kit (On days they have PE)

Students will also benefit from having a Casio FX83GTX calculator, which are available to purchase from the Academy.

It is highly recommended students bring a school bag pack to keep their personal belongings and a pencil case to contain their stationery.

Stationery and a fully equipped pencil case is available to purchase from the Academy via ParentMail.

MOBILE PHONES AND ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Mobile phones and other electronic devices are not allowed to be used on the Academy premises at any time. We operate an “on site, out of sight” policy so in the event that your child does carry a mobile phone/electronic device to the Academy, this must not be seen or heard from the moment they come through the Academy gates. If a mobile phone is seen / used during the Academy day, it will be confiscated and only returned when a parent or carer collects it from the Academy after 3:05pm.

If you need to contact your child during the Academy day, please contact the Academy Reception and we will get a message to your child as soon as possible.





KEY STAGE 3 CURRICULUM

Throughout years 7 and 8, Key Stage 3 students will experience the full statutory range of subjects of the National Curriculum, including citizenship, religious education, sex and relationship education and other aspects of PSHE and careers education.

Students are taught within two equal ability bands called J and L and are placed into sets within these bands based on prior attainment and ability in a specific subject. Subjects studied at this stage allow students to engage in a full range of learning and provide excellent foundations for GCSE study, which begins in Year 9.

We believe the curriculum should be relevant, engaging and interesting and enable students to make good progress through effective differentiation according to need.

HOMEWORK

At the Academy, we believe that regular homework is vital in securing the very best results for our students. Homework also provides opportunities for reinforcement of work learned during school time and for children to develop their research skills. Students are encouraged to record homework set each day in their planners and parents are able to monitor homework for their child on Ruler Parent.

The Academy Homework Timetable is available on our website.

GIFTED AND TALENTED

At Joseph Leckie Academy, we are always looking to identify students with excellent abilities, talents and potential. Students with such attributes will be offered opportunities to assist their development. Excursions and trips along with guidance will be offered to give both insight and reward for achievements made. We aim for every student to meet or surpass their potential and through this initiative we hope to achieve this.

STUDENT SUPPORT

Our Student Support Centre works alongside all Head of Years and Staff at Joseph Leckie Academy to ensure the wellbeing and happiness of your child. This is paramount to us to ensure their individual success not only at school but for their future.

Starting Secondary school can be very daunting not only for your child but for you as their Parent/Carer. We are here to liaise with you and to meet all the needs of your child. We are available for advice, questions, referrals and any information you may require or may be worried about to put your mind at ease.

LEARNING SUPPORT (SEND)

I am Mr Wallworth, the Head of Learning Support. I have been in post three years and have a team of 18 Teaching Assistants. We will all be working closely with the Head of Year to ensure that your child's transition to Joseph Leckie Academy meets their individual needs.

At Joseph Leckie Academy, we recognise that transition can be a difficult time for all children especially children with additional needs. I would like to take this opportunity to assure you that we will take steps to ensure that your child's move from their primary school to Joseph Leckie Academy will be as smooth as possible.

Even during these difficult times, we have been working in partnership with our feeder schools to ensure we have as much information about your child as possible, to support their move and understand their preferred learning style. Your child's transition to our Academy is a key priority to me and I will be available to discuss this with you via email or on the telephone.

All students with additional needs benefit from a personalised pupil passport and this will be completed with the support of a Teaching Assistant and shared with all teachers. Furthermore, my team of Teaching Assistants and I will do all we can to ensure we are here to support yours and your child's needs.

Some of the activities available are:



ACADEMY HOUSE SYSTEM

Our main aim at Joseph Leckie Academy is to ensure your child leaves school equipped with the tools needed for life. The most obvious way to do this is to achieve good exam results but we know there is more to Academy life than this. This is where the house system comes in!

Zodiac house is led by Mr Potter and are named after a group of Stars in the sky. Zodiac members wear Yellow.




LIBRARY
